- **Auto Theft**

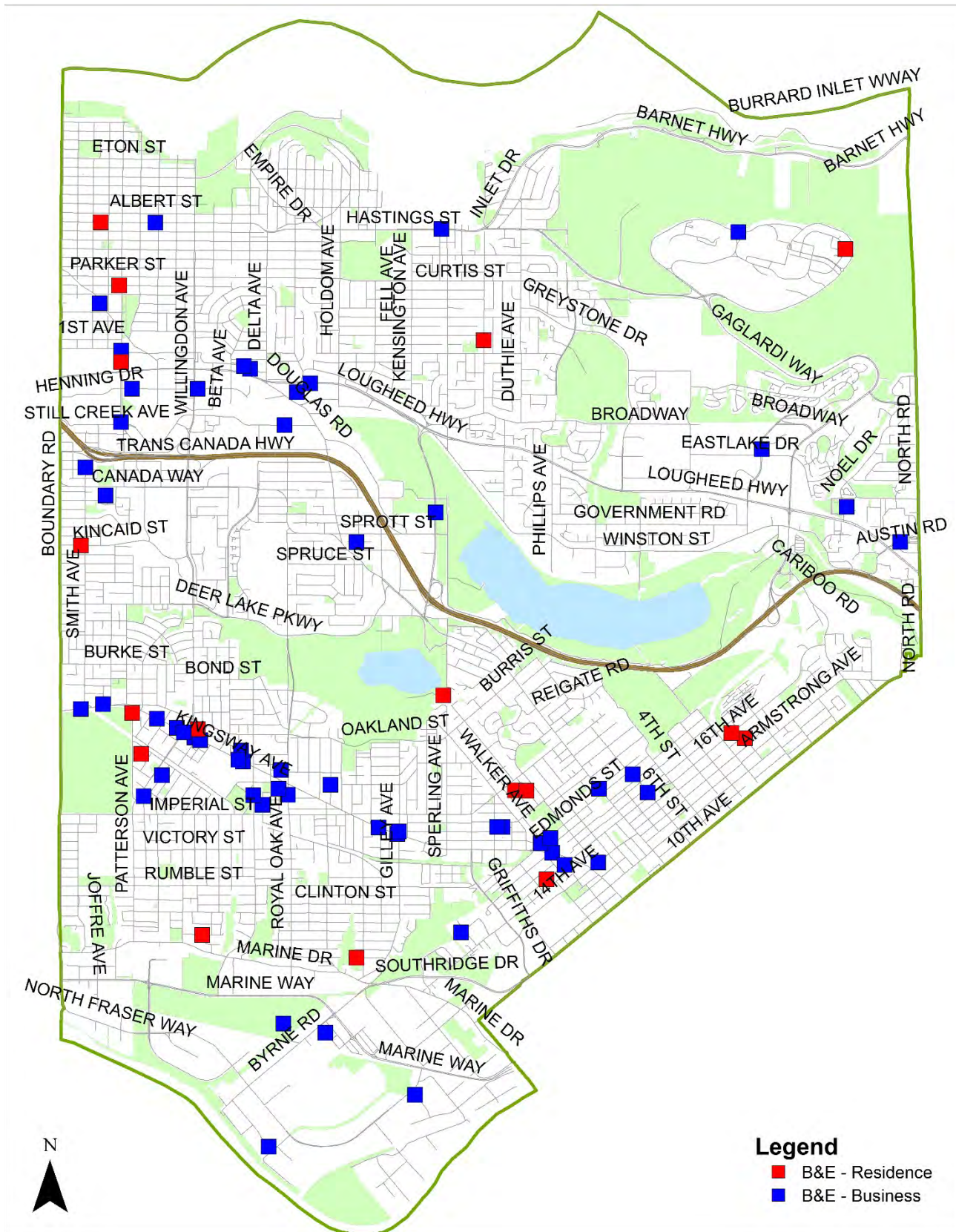

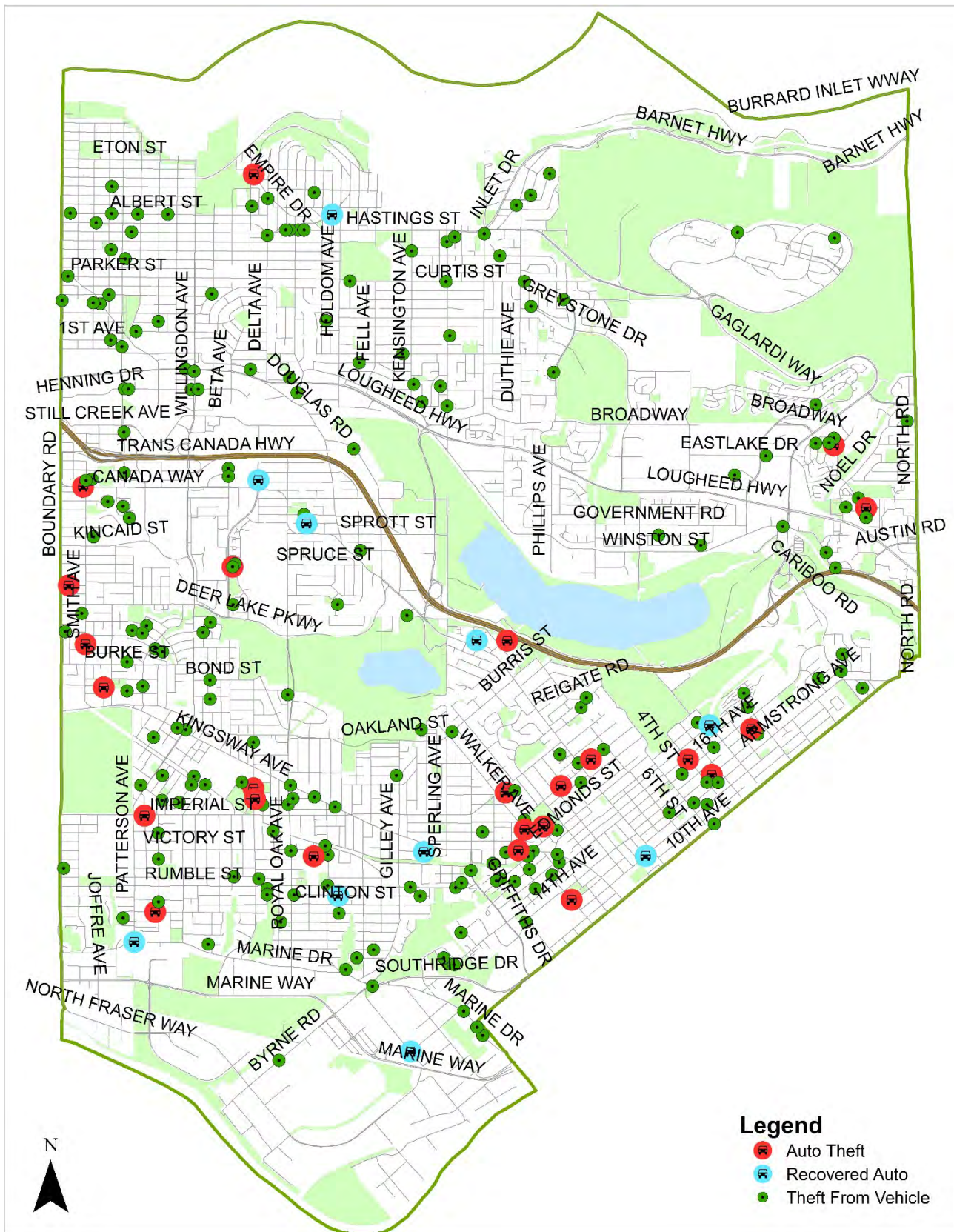


Crime Map – Break and Enter

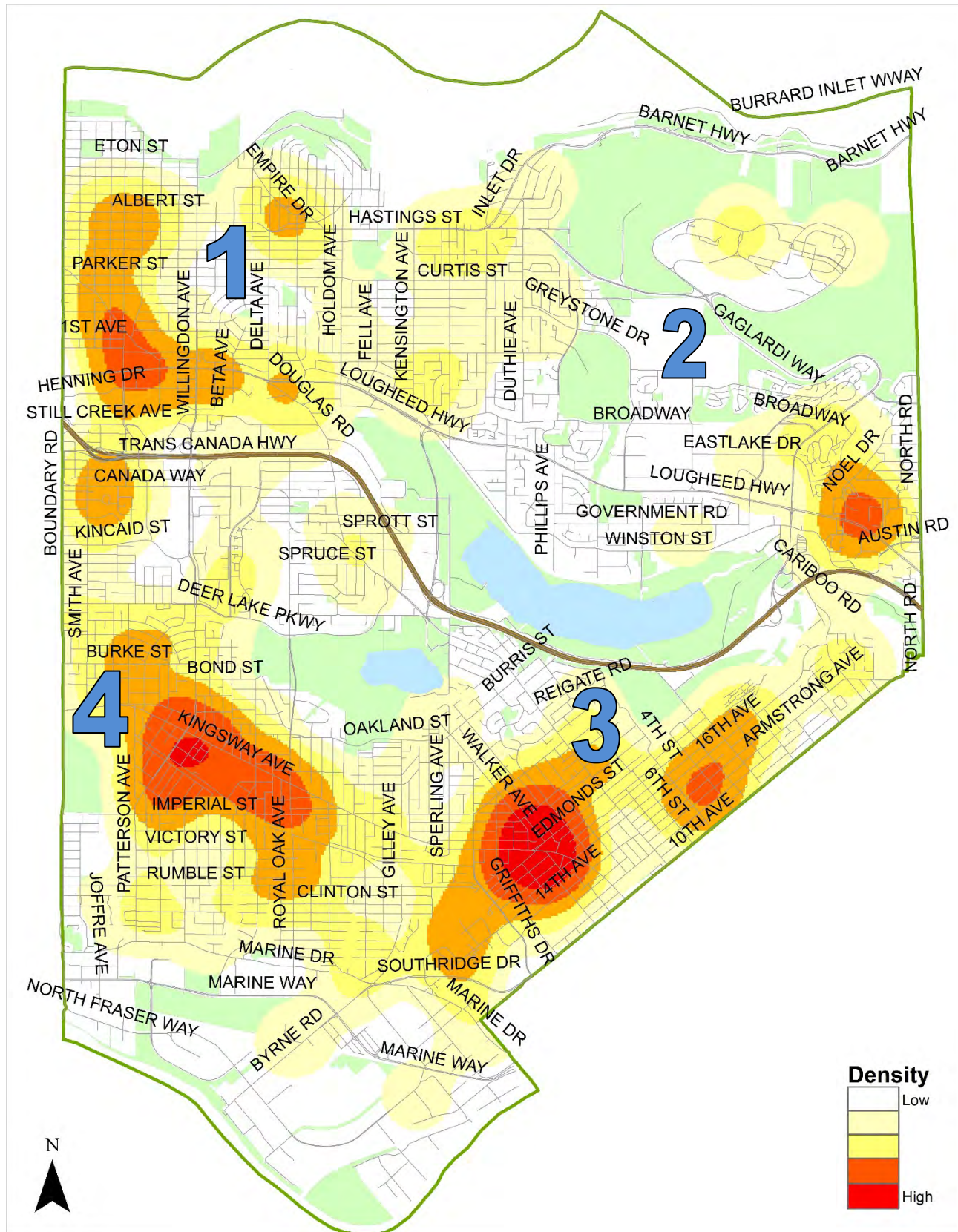
Crime Map – Auto Crime

AUTO CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

Most theft-from-auto and theft-of-auto crime is opportunistic in nature. It is important to take preventative measures to save you from any potential damages to your vehicle or loss of valuables.



FOR YOUR VEHICLE

- Engrave your VIN (Vehicle registration number) on all the removable parts.
- If possible, remove your vehicle insurance papers from the vehicle when you park for the night.

- It may sound simple, but lock up your vehicle and make sure to close the windows and sunroof.
- Leave no items in plain view, even loose change should not be visible.
- Install a car alarm if your vehicle doesn't come with one.
- Even if you have a newer vehicle with built-in theft prevention devices, it may still be worth putting a steering wheel lock on as car thieves count on a speedy getaway.

WHERE YOU PARK

- If you have a garage, all doors should be closed and locked.
- Seek out well lit spots with other vehicles and pedestrian traffic because this may deter thieves.
- Do not leave spare key inside the vehicle.
- Don't leave gardening tools outside your home – thieves may use them to break into your vehicle.
- If you park your vehicle in your driveway, have sufficient lighting such as motion sensor lights.
- Never leave your vehicle unattended with the engine running.
